WHAT'S HAPPENING

Welcome to all as we come together this Sunday. We are glad you have chosen to come to the Transitional Cathedral today. God bless you and your family, friends and, today especially, your pets.

This morning at 10am we celebrate **The Antarctic Service**: to ask God's blessing upon all those who go South for the new season. We welcome you to this important service, held alongside our city and the Antarctic scientific communities. As this is a service without Communion, said Services of Holy Eucharist will also be held at 8am and 11.30am today.

As we continue through spring, with the promise of summer ahead, **The Yarn** knitting group which has run over the winter months will be going on hiatus. Our thanks to everyone who has supported and been a part of this community within our Cathedral. We look forward to its return next year.

After eighteen months of frantic fundraising the **Cathedral Choristers tour to Sydney, Tokyo and Kyoto** has left New Zealand. We ask you to hold them in your prayers as they travel and sing a series of services, concerts and recitals. 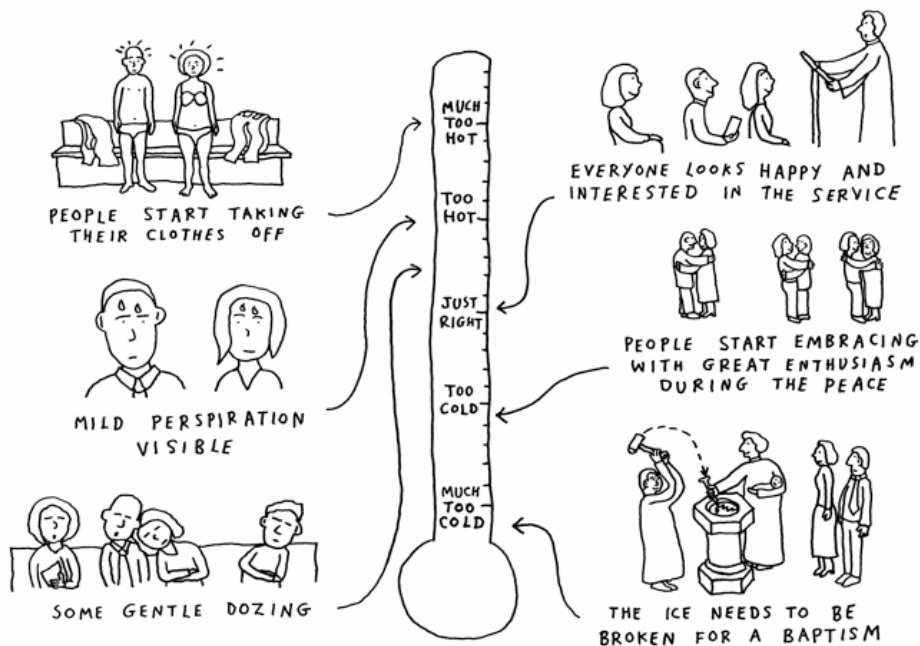

Welcome to the Transitional Cathedral, the broad tent with a wide-open door. If you are a visitor to Christchurch or from one of the parishes in this Diocese, our prayer is that in our worship today you will know that the love of God is for you.

This morning the Cathedral welcomes those supporting the Antarctic programme for the 2018 - 2019 season. I extend a very warm welcome to the Mayor of Christchurch, Lianne Dalziel, members of the diplomatic corps, members of the armed forces, scientists, logistics staff, and visitors who are associated with this programme. Today we will pray for the safety of those travelling to the Antarctic, and we will hand over the Chalice for use in the unique Chapel of the Snows at McMurdo base. Please welcome our speaker today, Dr Therese Arseneau, Chairperson of ChristchurchNZ, the City's economic development and city profile agency. According to its website, ChristchurchNZ is 'charged with igniting bold ambition, excitement, connecting changemakers, stimulating economic activity and attracting visitors to Ōtautahi Christchurch.'

I am delighted that the Cathedral is able to offer this prayer today to send people on their way south. Those travelling to the ice visit a place of great awe and beauty, danger and mystery. The research they undertake is invaluable to understanding our amazing world. And as stewards of this planet, we need to improve our knowledge so that we can better look after it.

As the new season gets underway, Christchurch hosts many visitors from around the world who will be on their way to begin working on the Antarctic continent. New Zealand's own contribution to this work is backed up by 60 years of experience of working in Antarctica. New Zealand is a recognised leader in this scientific research, which underpins New Zealand's strong commitment to environmental protection.
